# Ensuring Accessibility



D91 conducts annual website audits to ensure compliance with Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 & Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 for online services & programs. Staff accessibility training is provided upon need and on demand via [sbruemmer@d91.net](mailto:sbruemmer@d91.net).

# WHY?

School districts are public entities under Section 504 and Title II of the ADA. Districts are required to make their websites accessible to individuals with disabilities by removing all barriers that may prevent access. Section 504 and the ADA require that students, parents and members of the public are able to independently acquire the same information, engage in the same interactions, and enjoy the same benefits and services within the same timeframe as their non-disabled peers, with substantially equivalent ease of use; and that they are not excluded from participation in, denied the benefits of, or otherwise subjected to discrimination in any school or district programs, services, and activities delivered online.

Because individuals with disabilities may utilize assistive technology, such as screen reading software (which allows a person to “hear” what the webpage is displaying) or keyboard, when accessing a district’s website, districts must ensure that the content and functionality of their websites (and all intranet pages such as classroom webpages) are developed in such a manner that the information is properly conveyed when accessed by screen reading software, or other assistive device(s).

- Demonstrate D91's commitment to ensure that people with disabilities have opportunities equal to those of others to enjoy online programs, services, and activities.
- Conduct annual and real-time audits of existing online content and functionality
- Adopt policies & procedures to ensure that all new, newly added or modified online content & functionality will be accessible to people with disabilities
- Post a notice to persons with disabilities about how to request access to online information or functionality that is currently inaccessible
- Provide website accessibility training to all appropriate personnel on demand via [sbruemmer@d91.net](mailto:sbruemmer@d91.net)
